Since 1956, Prairie Clinic has been caring for patients of all ages in Sauk City, Prairie du Sac, and the surrounding rural communities. As an independent clinic, Prairie Clinic has grown with the community and currently offers a variety of health care services in Family Medicine, Pediatric, and Obstetrics and Gynecology services. Staff and physicians take a home town long-term approach to relationships and patient care. Prairie clinic is an easily commutable drive from downtown Madison which is just 25 miles away.



Rotation Experience

To provide a full-spectrum rural rotation, Prairie Clinic works collaboratively with Sauk Prairie Hospital to expose residents to a wide variety of training opportunities in Family Medicine. Physicians are motivated to teach and have a breadth of unique experiences to compliment the resident-learners experiences. Residents will work side-by-side preceptors in clinic, hospital, and nursing home settings. Not only will residents care for patients with acute and chronic medical conditions, but will also




learn how to do preventive health, all of which are necessary skills to prepare for rural practice. This rotation includes time in the local emergency room as well as rounding with local hospitalists and obstetricians in the hospital.

Community Highlights

With a combined population of 7,400, the two Wisconsin River towns of Prairie du Sac and Sauk City are so close together they are often referred to as "Sauk Prairie." Visitors experience year round opportunities for recreational activities such as biking, canoeing, kayaking, snowmobiling, fishing, camping, and more. The towns are a favorite winter destination for birders, as a hydro-electric plant just north of town keeps a large pool of the river open in winter attracting dozens of eagles who fish those waters. Just across the river, the Wollersheim Winery is a favorite stop for wine lovers any time of year. Popular community festivals include Bald Eagle Days in January and the Wisconsin State Cow Chip Throw in September.

Just north of Sauk Prairie is Devil's Lake State Park, a favorite for all who love the outdoors. This 10,000-acre gem offers 423 family campsites, 29 miles of hiking trails, 6 miles of mountain bike trails, and views of its lovely namesake lake from high atop the park's 300-foot bluffs.



his BA in Geology in 2000 from Williams College in Williamstown, Massachusetts, then he returned closer to home to study for his MD at the University of Colorado School of Medicine, which he earned in 2005. In 2008, Dr. Adams completed his coast-to-coast education when he completed his residency at the Contra Costa Medical Center in Martinez, California. Dr. Adams is board certified in Family Medicine.



Trevver Buss, MD, is a Wisconsin native and earned his baccalaureate of science degree in Molecular Biology at the University of Wisconsin - Madison, where he was a Medical

Dr. Baker is board certified in Family Medicine and has interests in women's health, obstetrics, and family health. Dr. Baker joined Prairie Clinic in 1995.



Barclay Shultz, MD, earned his baccalaureate in physics at Grinnell College in Grinnell, Iowa. From 1974-1978, he worked with the Peace Corps in Africa, teaching physics and math. Dr.

After multiple years as a medical volunteer in Africa, Dr. Shultz moved to the Sauk Prairie area and joined Prairie Clinic in 1991. Continuing his education, Dr. Shultz earned a masters in anatomy, with an emphasis on clinical anatomy, at the University of Wisconsin in 1997.



Jessica Darling, DO, graduated Magna Cum Laude with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science. She went on to the New York College of Osteopathic Medicine where she earned

her degree in Osteopathy, which combines a traditional medical curriculum with an emphasis on the musculoskeletal system. Dr. Darling came to the Sauk Prairie area because of the natural beauty of the area and the close-knit community that reminded her of home. She joined the Prairie Clinic family for their commitment to the health and well-being of our patients and community.
